## **DATA SUMMARY**

**As of March 25, 2022**: (using the last 14 days of full data and last 7 days of full data for positivity rate)

- <u>Incidence of New Cases</u>: **26** new cases over the last 14-day period **with no sustained increase over 5 consecutive days.**
- Active Cases: 8 cases with no sustained increase over 5 consecutive days over a 14-day period
- <u>Positivity Rate</u>: **3.38**% (last 7-days of full data). Testing below 30 tests per day indicates insufficient testing to adequately detect cases within the reservation. 5 of the 7 days were below 30 tested/day.
- **Health Care System Capacity**: Unstrained

## BASED ON THE ABOVE DATA THE CURRENT INDICATED RISK LEVEL IS: YELLOW LEVEL

**Note:** The number of new cases continue to meet one indicator in the Red Level, however the number of active cases is low with 7 of the 9 Districts with zero cases on March 25<sup>th</sup>. Testing continues to play an important role in preventing the spread of the virus and if you are self-testing, please contact the OST Public Health Authority with your results @ 867-1704. Per SDDOH Custer County is at a high-risk level and Penn Co. is a substantial risk, please take all precautions when traveling.
